The SCANDINAVIAN COLLECTORS CLUB was founded at metropolitan New York City in 1935 by 6 Finnish collectors in the Bronx as the "Finnish-American Stamp Club", and S.C.C. adopted its present name in February, 1943 at the suggestion of Harry L. Lindquist, publisher of STAMPS magazine. Our quarterly magazine "POSTHORN" sent to all members appeared first on the scene in November, 1943 with Carl E. Pelander (1872-1966) as its first Editor, when our membership stood at 42 men and women. We are thus one of the older specialty clubs in this country - we are a non-profit Illinois corporation since 1960.

We are primarily a specialist group whose purpose is to study the stamps of Denmark, Danish West Indies, Greenland, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden. In addition to chronicling all new issues with background data, each issue of the POSTHORN contains one of more research articles relating to printings, variations, and historical notes. Your own collections become more vital as these articles are absorbed into the pages of your albums.

The SCANDINAVIAN COLLECTORS CLUB is organized on an International basis with the bulk of membership within the U. S. and Canada, but many of the Western European countries are well represented also
