

It started when I read an article in a European publication stating that there is an absence of articles in the English language on Icelandic philately. That statement created the challenge and is answered by the following bibliography of 561 articles appearing in 638 issues of 57 periodicals. There are also an additional 55 books, handbooks and catalogs listed.

Research was done with the help of Lois Evans of the American Philatelic Research Library, Ernst Wilkins of the Collectors Club of New York Library, Reidar Norby of the Postal History Division of the Smithsonian Institution and the tremendous work of C. Nieuwland of the Scandinavian International Philately in the Netherlands. The facilities of the Collector's Club of Chicago Library also proved an invaluable aid as a source of many of the publications.

Although non-philatelic, it is worth mentioning that an excellent Map of Iceland in color is available from the Superintendent of Documents, U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. 20402. The stock number is

4115-00040 and the price is 60 cents.

I would appreciate knowing of any additions to this bibliography. A copy of the article would be helpful for the annotation. A separate monograph may be published in the future with a cross-reference by subject based on the Smithsonian Institution's Division of Postal History categories.




