Triple Header

The Scandinavian Collectors Club will present not one, not two, but three programs at its meeting on **January 11, 7pm**, at **Danish American Center**.



Seija-Riitta Laakso will present Finnish meter marks. Pictured above is a parcel address card dated Helsinki, September 12, 1927. The parcel was franked with 5 merkki in a red meter mark by a postal franking machine licensed to the firm Karl Fazer, manufacturer of milk chocolates.

Judy Harder will present "Nobel Prize Winners on Swedish Stamps". Swedish chemist Alfred Nobel (1830-1896) invented dynamite and bequeathed his fortune to establish the Nobel Prize. He is depicted below on the 2001 issue commemorating the Centenary of the Nobel Prizes (F2249). German theologian, humanitarian, philosopher, and physician Albert Schweitzer (1875-1965) was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1953 and shown below on a 1991 issue (F1709).









The 2023 Norway issues will be presented by **Steve Opheim** including the above issues (NK2101/2102) from May 14 depicting the Crown Prince Haakan Magnus and Crown Princess Mette-Merit both celebrating their 50th Birthdays in 2023. Another highlight is the October 7 prestige booklet depicting four inland ferries that along with others transport 20 million cars and 40 million passengers each year.

180,000 Came to Stamp Exhibition

Reports about the attendance at stamp exhibitions around the world are in part frightening reading. Fewer and fewer attend and it is sparse at the frames. That the largest annual exhibition in the USA is very pleased with 2500 visiting is set in a special light now that we have received the numbers from the international stamp exhibition in Taipei, Taiwan. In the span of five days in August the organizers report an unbelievable attendance of 180,000! Another publication stretches this and reports 330,000!!! The second total we take with a pinch of reality, but nearly two hundred thousand people at a stamp exhibition is not bad. And it was also emphasized that it was full of children! Shall we believe that philately's future lies in Asia? If we divide up the attendance numbers across 5 days, we come up with 36,000 visitors per day. We tip our hats!

TAIPEI 2023 - 39TH ASIAN INTERNATIONAL STAMP EXHIBITION

Unprecedented media coverage and large crowds were reported in <u>TAIPEI 2023 – 39th Asian International Stamp Exhibition</u> (11-15 August). Tony Shields (Shields Stamps, Melbourne, Australia) posted on his Facebook page that "The final attendance at the stamp exhibition was 330,000 people. Total cost of the show was nearly A\$2,000,000 which was mostly paid by Taiwan Post Office, and their sales were A\$5,000,000 at the exhibition. What a stunning set of figures."

The exhibition was announced in 2018, originally scheduled for 2020. It was postponed to 2021, again to 2022, and finally to 2023, all because of Covid-19. Naturally, it was eagerly anticipated by the local philatelic community.

Taipei international show draws 180,000

3 MONTHS AGO

Taipei 2023, the 39th Asian International Stamp Exhibition, closed on Aug. 15 after drawing more than 180,000 show-goers over five days.

According to Chunghwa Post, one of the show organizers, this year's exhibition marked the largest international event since the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic.

As a footnote to all of the above, the editors of *AFA Skandinavien Frimærkekatalogen 2024* state that catalog values reflect the current market with stagnating numbers of collectors from Scandinavian and European countries but growing number of collectors from other parts of the world.
